Mandatory e-filing

In an effort to increase efficiency and reduce errors, the IRS requires all tax preparers, including Salmon Sims Thomas, to electronically file federal income tax returns for individuals, trusts, and estates. As the taxpayer, you will have the choice to opt-out of e-filing and choose paper filing. However, (there's always a "however") our firm will need to document your choice to file in paper format and keep a signed copy of the statement on file.
